With a large variety of academic and scientific resources, its automated library management, and updated RFID-based book circulation system, the Central Library is one of the key central facilities of IIT Madras, meeting the information demands of researchers, faculty, staff, and students.

It is a vibrant campus space that provides a safe, comfortable, and welcoming setting for learning and

knowledge advancement, as well as discovery and scholarship.

There are reading rooms on each of the library's five floors. In addition, we have our own children's library and a gallery reading hall on the first floor.

On the third floor of the building, our library has its own conference hall known as the Media Resource Centre (MRC). This MRC is used for all library-organized activities.



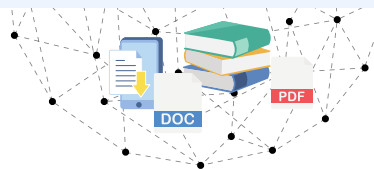

# Our Resources



## On the Shelf and Online

The Central Library houses around 263600 books, 17000 gratis books, and 18081 e-books. We have subscription to e-resources from over 70 publishers across the world and contains a collection of over 15,000 e-journals, 28 full-text, statistical, and bibliographical databases, 7 standards and patents databases, and 11 research assistance tools.

The library's print materials, including books, are arranged according to subject. Our **library's website** includes a list of the electronic resources that IIT Madras has subscription to.

E-resources include e-journals, various bibliographic, full-text, statistical, interactive, standards, and patent databases. E-resources can be browsed and downloaded as a single copy of an article, just like traditional library items.

It is expressly forbidden to use robots, spiders, or intelligent agents to access, search, or systematically download these materials.

## Get to know our resources: abstracting and indexing databases

### Scopus

Scopus, launched in 2004 by Elsevier is the largest abstract and citation database of peer-reviewed literature.

Scopus uniquely combines a comprehensive, expertly curated abstract and citation database with enriched data and linked scholarly literature across a wide variety of disciplines. Over 24,000 journals are indexed by Scopus. The h-index, SJR, and SNIP are only a few of the metrics offered by Scopus to measure the impact of research.

Scopus identifies experts, locates pertinent and reputable research, and gives users access to trustworthy data, metrics, and analytical tools. Using one database, you can move your research, teaching, or other priorities forward with confidence.

### Web of Science Core Collection

Web of Science Core Collection is a comprehensive academic citation database maintained by Clarivate Analytics. It indexes and makes scholarly material from a variety of subjects easily accessible.

The Web of Science Core Collection covers more than 250 different fields of study. The database includes over 2.2 billion cited references and has records dating back to 1900, totaling over 92 million. It indexes more than 22,000 peer-reviewed journals and includes papers from about 308,000 conferences. With coverage across 254 subject categories spanning sciences, social sciences, arts, and humanities, it's a comprehensive tool for accessing academic information in many disciplines.



#### DID YOU KNOW?

The Library of Congress of USA is the largest library in the world. Also the largest book in the Library is a 5-by-7 foot book featuring color images of Bhutan.

It was originally meant to provide books solely for use of Congress.

## How to get a book from the stacks?



To check whether a book is available in the stacks, visit the Central Library's **Web OPAC**. A complete list of the books in our collection can be found in the Library OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) database. The OPAC search results contain a book's call number, accession number, bibliographic information and location within the library.

For easy identification, every book in the library's collection has a Call Number (subject code) label attached to the spine. Based on that books are arranged in stacks across various floors in separate reading halls. So one basically needs to have a call number to trace a book in the library.





# From the Archives\*\* 60 years of IITM Library

The Central Library began operations on a minor scale in 1959, with roughly 6,000 books and 204 journals from the Department of Civil Engineering building. To function efficiently as a Technical University Library, the Central Library was relocated to an independent building in front of the Institute's Main Guest House.

This was the third location for the IIT Madras Library; the first was on the third floor of A. C. College of Technology (until August 1961) and the second was on the second floor of the Building Sciences Block (until July 1967). For 33 years, the third building housed the Central Library, and it is now home to the IIT Madras Department of Management Studies (DoMS).

By 1967, the library's collection had grown to 69,799 volumes and pamphlets. The library became a bustling place by the time. According to the Annual Reports for 1967-68, the total attendance of library members throughout the academic year was 1,08,000, and the number of books and periodicals issued was 1,26,000.

In light of recent developments and future requirements, the Institute decided to construct a Library Building with then-state-of-the-art facilities. On July 7, 2000, the first phase of the Central Library the “Millennium Building” was constructed. By 2004, three more levels had been added to the existing structure in the second phase. The library then became 5 storied. The Digital Knowledge Centre - a section within the library with 101 computer systems that provide computer access service to users so that they can use the Central Library’s subscribed e-resources - was also facilitated by 30-06-2004.



Library Automation Software

With the deployment of Virtua software from VTLS Inc. for library operations in 2005, the Central Library switched its work to a fully automated mode.

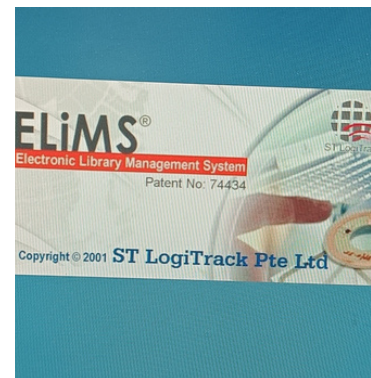
Within the main building, the library also has established its own children’s library to provide a engaging and reading environment to the faculty and staff kids.





In 2011, the existing RFID-based Library circulation system was upgraded to RFID Hybrid firmware, which included

- 1) Hardware to enable RFID-compliant I-code -1 and I-code -2 tags.
- 2) Self-service check-out stations
- 3) Drop boxes for books
- 4) EAS security barrier
- 5) RFID- based circulation transactions are now supported by the ELiMS server.



In 2016, the Central Library launched IRepose, an institutional digital repository powered by DSpace digital library software.

It maintains and makes available all of IIT Madras' scholarly works, including journal articles, book chapters, conference papers, working papers, technical reports, and so on.

The Central Library initiated the **IITM Scholars Profiles** via the IRINS (Indian Research Information Network System) in 2017. INFLIBNET Centre created IRINS, a web-based Research Information Management (RIM) service. It has merged with academic identities such as ORCID ID, Scopus ID, Research ID, Microsoft Academic ID, and Google Scholar ID to absorb scholarly publications from diverse sources.

- Citation analysis and reports, h-Index of authors & institutions
- How to find the right journal for publication
- Analysis of search results to find Top authors, journals, institutions, publications etc.
- Research output and impact on overall h-Index
- Impact Factor and its significance in research
- Various search methods and refine search options
- Tools available for disambiguation of authors and institutions
- Analyze and find the co-authors, access collaborations and find suitable funding agencies based on the research area
- Benchmarking & Analytics research evaluation tool that can help you develop your research strategy

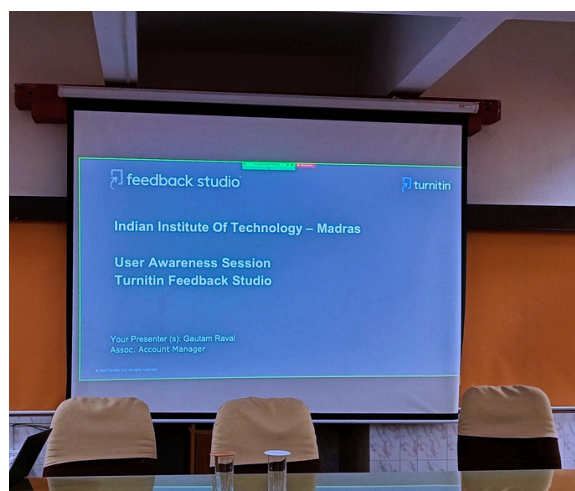
## Turnitin Feedback Studio Training Programme
